## **GPS INFORMATION**

When using the GPS feature of the MC75:

- Acquiring satellite signals may take a few minutes. It is best to be outside and have a clear, unobstructed view of the sky.
- · Without a clear view, acquisition takes much longer and could result in the MC75 being unable to compute the initial position quickly.
- Obtain a satellite fix before moving.
- Shutdown GPS application when not in use.
